



GRULAC's authorities from 2000 to date

October 2023 – October 2025

- **Interim President:** Manzoor Nadir (Guyana) as of 1 September 2024 - – *assumes the Presidency in his capacity as First Vice-President, replacing Ms. Sofía Carvajal (Mexico) who ceased to be a member of Parliament*
- **President:** Sofía CARVAJAL (Mexico) until August 31, 2024
- **First Vice President:** Manzoor Nadir (Guyana)
- **First Vice President:** Lucila CREXELL (Argentina) – Second Vice President until October 2024, when she assumes the **First Vice Presidency**
- **Second Vice President:** Rojo Edwards (Chile), who took office in October 2024, following the succession of Senator Crexell (Argentina) to the First Vice Presidency.
In accordance with President Manzoor Nadir's instructions, Senator Rojo Edwards will serve on the Bureau until the end of his term. Prior to the invitation, the President consulted with the members present at the meeting.

November 2021 – October 2023

- **Interim President:** Atila LINS (Brazil) from 1 July 2023 – *assumes the Presidency in his capacity as First Vice President*
- **President:** Blas LLANO (Paraguay) – until June 30, 2023 (he ceased to be a parliamentarian)

October 2019 – November 2021

In October 2020, GRULAC's Bureau was not renewed due to the impossibility of holding in-person elections due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
